

A Message from Pastor Andrea

"I just don't get it. Why do we even need atonement theories?"

This is the question I received from a delightful church member who loves Jesus but just doesn't see why all this is so important. I love this question.

I also understand this question. Sometimes it can seem like we're just aimlessly discussing one option after another, never even landing on one right answer. Why bother?

In pondering that question, I've realized that the value of discussions like these is directly related to the purpose for the discussion. I want to keep reminding us (and myself!) that the goal is not to choose the right theory, or to pick our favorite and forget all the others.

The goal of our discussions is to help us obtain a broader understanding of the cross of Christ in order that we may (1) know Jesus better, and (2) live transformed lives.

Whether we know it or not, our views on atonement impact how we view the world around us. If our views on atonement involve a God who is angry at humanity, surely that impacts how we, too, view humanity (including how we view ourselves).

If our views on atonement involve a nonviolent God, surely that impacts how we address matters of violence in our society.

If our views on atonement include a Christ who rose victorious over death, surely that too will impact how we wrestle with our own fears and our own mortality.

My hope is that hearing all of these theories (again) will ignite in us more amazement, more mystery, and more wonder at this fully human, fully divine being who gave himself for us—because he did give himself for us, in so many ways, including but not limited to his death on the cross.

"For God so loved the world," as John tells us. As each day of this month marches us closer to Good Friday, as each atonement theory unveils a little bit more truth: I pray we will all know that love. I pray we will marvel at it. And I pray we would let it take root in us, transforming us from the inside out.



K-D Belcher, the Executive Director, began the program 10 years ago in response to the needs of the homeless she saw living on our downtown streets. On the evening of February 12th John Boley, Aaron Huffman, Naomi Niles, David Privott, Ann Summa, Brad Summa, and Rich Truex continued that mission by distributing most of Dayspring's donations at the 10 stops the group made in downtown St. Louis. K-D and some experienced Street Patrollers led our carpool caravan through city streets and into some scary places where we found the homeless camps. It was an experience that all seven said they want to repeat.





Kids' Day Out


Early Childhood Learning Program for ages 2-5 (pre-kindergarten)


